

AVERAGE CARTRIDGE YIELDS

Estimated cartridge yields are based on a 5% page coverage (approximately a standard 1/2 page letter). Graphics and bold borders and charts will increase page coverage and reduce yield. Our remanufactured cartridges are guaranteed to equal the OEM yield in the same applications.

HOW TO MEASURE CARTRIDGE YIELD

It is recommended that you occasionally check your specific cartridge yield to make and sure your printer and cartridge are performing adequately. Simply run the following test page at the beginning and end of a cartridge cycle. Subtract the start number from the final count and this will give you your exact cartridge yield. The remanufactured cartridges are guaranteed to last as long as new ones!

Page Count for HP Series II III; IP & IIP; III/4si Printers

Press the ON LINE button once taking the printer " off line". Press the TEST FONT button on the display panel. Hold it down until it says 05 SELF TEST. Release the button. A page will print that tells the exact number of pages printed from the printer (like an odometer on a car). There will be a line that states PAGE COUNT: then a #. This is your current page count.

Page Count for HP 4 & 5 Printer

Take the printer OFF LINE. Push MENU till it displays TEST. Then push item until it says SELF TEST. Press ENTER. This will print your test page with the page count listed.

CARING FOR YOUR PRINTER

Your laser printer was designed for easy maintenance and reliable, high quality output. But, easy maintenance does not mean no maintenance. By occasionally taking a few minutes to care for your printer, you can extend its life, reduce service calls and ensure optimum, trouble-free operation for many thousands of copies.

- **Printers need to breathe.** Make certain the area around your printer's air vent is kept free of clutter, paper, books or other office paraphernalia that can prevent air movement to and from your printer.
- **Printers don't drink.** In fact, they strongly object to any kind of liquid intake. Avoid spills on your printer by keeping coffee and soft drinks at a distance.
- **Printers are allergic to dust.** Routinely wipe off your printer's exterior and the area around it with a clean cloth.. (Pay careful attention to the paper tray where paper dust accumulates). Never clean with liquid chemical cleaners as some printer parts can be damaged by moisture.
- **Printers are nonviolent.** Don't try to force anything into your printer (toner cartridge, paper, paper tray, etc). All components of your printer were designed for easy use and installation.
